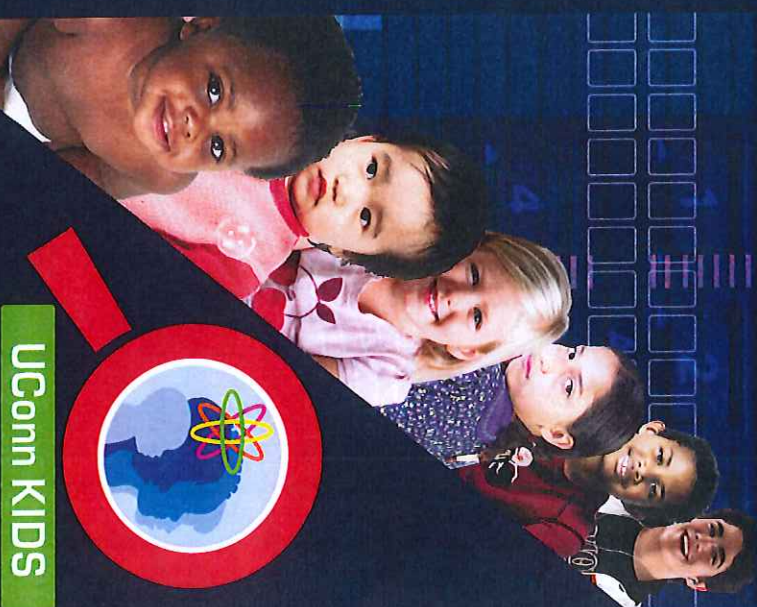

## What is UConn KIDS?

**UConn KIDS** stands for Kids in Developmental Science. We are a research participant contact database encompassing studies done across a number of different departments and labs in child behavioral research at the University of Connecticut.

These departments include:

- Cognitive Science
- Educational Psychology
- Human Development & Family Studies
- Linguistics
- Psychology
- Speech, Language & Hearing Sciences
- The Rudd Center for Food Policy and Obesity

We are recruiting for all kinds of children. Research across labs varies in child age range and focus. Early cognitive development, peer relations, and language acquisition/understanding are a just a few among the many research topics studied by **UConn KIDS**.

This research is carried out on-site (at our Storrs, Waterbury or Hartford campuses) or off-site, in daycares, elementary, middle or high schools.

## What Would Participation Mean?

Joining **UConn KIDS** allows parents to be contacted (via email or phone) about particular studies that their child or children are eligible for. Parents may also express interest for specific studies through the database online once they join.

As always, when contacted, parents can choose whether or not they want their child to participate.
